## COMMERCIAL PASSENGER (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS

#### Regulations under the Commercial Passenger (Road) Transport Act

#### 1 Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Commercial Passenger* (*Miscellaneous*) *Regulations*.

#### 2 Infringement offences prescribed

(1) In this regulation:

column means a column in Schedule 1.

- (2) An offence against a provision of the Act or the regulations, as the case may be, specified in column 2 and briefly described in column 3 is prescribed as infringement offence for the purposes of section 81 of the Act.
- (3) The penalty payable in relation to an infringement offence referred to in columns 2 and 3 is the amount specified opposite and corresponding to that offence in column 4.

## 3 Service

An infringement notice may be served on the alleged offender:

- (a) by serving it personally on the alleged offender;
- (b) by posting it to the alleged offender at his or her last known address which may be ascertained from any identification produced to the inspector or from any register maintained by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles; or
- (c) by leaving it for the alleged offender at his or her last known place of residence or business with some other person apparently resident or employed there and apparently not less than 16 years of age.

## 4 Payment by cheque

Where a person tenders a cheque in payment of a prescribed penalty payment shall be deemed not to have been made unless the cheque is honoured on presentation.

## 5 Withdrawal of infringement notice

- (1) An infringement notice may be withdrawn at any time within 28 days after service of the infringement notice but before payment of the penalty specified in the infringement notice by serving on the alleged offender a notice:
  - (a) signed by the Director or a person authorized by the Director; and
  - (b) stating that the infringement notice is withdrawn.
- (2) A notice of withdrawal of an infringement notice referred to in subregulation (1) may be served on the alleged offender:
  - (a) by serving it personally on him or her;
  - (b) by posting it to the alleged offender at his or her last known address which may be ascertained from any identification produced by the alleged offender or from any register maintained by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles; or
  - (c) by leaving it for the alleged offender at his or her last known place of residence or business with some other person apparently resident or employed there and apparently not less than 16 years of age.

## 6 Fees

The fees set out in Schedule 2 are payable in relation to the matter specified in that Schedule.
