



NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA

No. 9 of 1987

AN ACT

to revise and correct the law of the Territory
in minor respects

[Assented to on 27 May, 1987]

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory of Australia, with the assent as provided by the *Northern Territory (Self-Government) Act 1978* of the Commonwealth, as follows:

1. SHORT TITLE

This Act may be cited as the *Statute Law Revision Act 1987*.

2. REVISION OF ACT

The provisions of the Acts specified in Schedule 1 are amended as provided for in that Schedule.

3. REVISION OF REGULATIONS

(1) The provisions of the Regulations specified in Schedule 2 are amended as provided for in that Schedule.

(2) A provision amended as provided for in Schedule 2, may be further amended by Regulations as if the amendments effected by this Act were duly made by Regulations.
