

NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA

A BILL for AN ACT

to amend the Summary Offences Act

B^E it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory of Australia, with the assent as provided by the Northern Territory (Self-Government) Act 1978 of the Commonwealth, as follows:

1. Short Title

This Act may be cited as the Summary Offences Amendment Act 1995.

2. Commencement

This Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Administrator by notice in the *Gazette*.

3. New section

The Summary Offences Act is amended by inserting after section 47AB the following:

"47AC. Loitering by sexual offender
