

Serial 48 Criminal Code Amendment (No. 2) Mr Manzie

NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA

A BILL for AN ACT

to amend the *Criminal Code* and to repeal certain Acts of the State of South Australia in their application to the Territory as laws of the Territory

B E it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory of Australia, with the assent as provided by the Northern Territory (Self-Government) Act 1978 of the Commonwealth, as follows:

1. SHORT TITLE

This Act may be cited as the Criminal Code Amendment Act (No. 2) 1991.

2. COMMENCEMENT

This Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Administrator by notice in the *Gazette*.

3. NEW SECTIONS

The Criminal Code is amended by inserting after section 435 the following:

"435A. TREASON, FELONY OR OTHER OFFENCES NOT TO ATTRACT LEGAL DISABILITY EXCEPT UNDER AN ACT

"A person who has been convicted of treason, a felony or other offences, whether before or after the commencement of this section, shall not, by reason of the conviction, suffer a legal disability except as prescribed by an Act of the Territory or of the Commonwealth.".

- 4. REPEAL OF CERTAIN SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ACTS IN THEIR APPLICATION TO TERRITORY AND TERRITORY ACT
- (1) The following Acts of the State of South Australia, in their application to the Territory as laws of the Territory, are repealed:

Treason Felony Act, 1868 (No. 2 of 1868);

- An Act to abolish Forfeitures for Treason and Felony, and to otherwise amend the law relating thereto (No. 25 of 1874).
- (2) The Treason and Felony Forfeiture Amendment Act (No. 84 of 1981) is repealed.
