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## **Regulations under the *Teacher Registration (Northern Territory) Act***

**TEACHER REGISTRATION (NORTHERN TERRITORY)  
REGULATIONS**

**1. Citation**

These Regulations may be cited as the Teacher Registration (Northern Territory) Regulations.

**2. Commencement**

These Regulations come into operation on the commencement of section 4 of the *Teacher Registration (Northern Territory) Act*.

**3. Attendance at meetings**

For section 18(2) of the Act, the Board will reimburse a school the expense incurred after receipt of an invoice from the school detailing the expense.

**4. Entitlement to registration**

(1) For section 33(2)(a) of the Act, the prescribed educational qualifications are –

- (a) a 4-year Degree of Education, or Diploma of Education and Degree, from Charles Darwin University (or the Northern Territory University as it was then known) or Batchelor Institute of Indigenous Tertiary Education;
- (b) a 4-year Degree of Education, obtained in a State or another Territory, that is –
  - (i) accredited by an accreditation body in that State or Territory; or
  - (ii) accepted for registration as a teacher by the registration authority in that State or Territory; or
- (c) a 4-year degree in education, obtained in a country outside Australia and New Zealand, that includes a minimum of 45 supervised practice teaching days and is –
  - (i) accepted for registration as a teacher by the registration authority of a State or another Territory; or
  - (ii) assessed by the Board as appropriate for registration in the Territory.

*Teacher Registration (Northern Territory) Regulations*

(2) For section 33(2)(b) of the Act, any of the following tests may be used for determining whether an applicant for registration is proficient in the English language:

- (a) the International English Language Testing System (IELTS);
- (b) the International Second Language Proficiency Ratings (ISLPR);
- (c) the Professional English Assessment for Teachers (PEAT).

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
