Regulations under the *Private Security Act*

I, NEIL RAYMOND CONN, the Administrator of the Northern Territory of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, make the following regulations under the *Private Security Act*.

PRIVATE SECURITY (SECURITY OFFICERS) REGULATIONS

1. CITATION

These Regulations may be cited as the Private Security (Security Officers) Regulations.

2. DISQUALIFYING OFFENCES

For the purposes of the definition of "disqualifying offence" in section 3 of the Act, an offence against section 161, 162, 163, 165, 166, 177, 181, 182, 186, 188, 189A, 189, 192, 192B, 193, 194, 195, 196, 211, 212, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231 or 233 of the Criminal Code is prescribed in relation to a security officer's licence and a security officer's provisional licence.

3. FORM

For the purposes of section 14(1) of the Act, the prescribed form for an application for a security officer's licence or a security officer's provisional licence is the form in the Schedule.

4. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED BY APPLICANT

For the purposes of section 14(5) of the Act, the following information is prescribed in relation to an application for a security officer's licence or a security officer's provisional licence:

* Notified in the Northern Territory Government Gazette on 4 August 1998.

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- (a) 2 identical current passport-sized photographs;
and
- (b) the fingerprints of the applicant.

5. PARTICULARS OF UNDERTAKINGS

For the purposes of section 50(2) of the Act, the following particulars in relation to a deed of undertaking executed by a security officer are prescribed:

- (a) the name of the security officer who executed the deed;
- (b) the number assigned by the licensing authority to the licence to which the deed relates;
- (c) the date on which the deed was executed;
- (d) a summary of the undertakings contained in the deed.

6. FEES

(1) For the purposes of section 18(2) of the Act, the fee for the grant of a security officer's provisional licence is -

- (a) where the applicant does not hold another licence under the Act - \$90; or
- (b) where the applicant holds another licence under the Act - \$70.

(2) For the purposes of section 18(3) of the Act, the fee for the grant of a security officer's licence is -

- (a) where the applicant does not hold another licence under the Act - \$90; or
- (b) where the applicant holds another licence under the Act - \$70.

(3) For the purposes of section 24(2) of the Act, the fee for the renewal of a security officer's licence is -

- (a) where the applicant does not hold another licence under the Act - \$90; or
- (b) where the applicant holds another licence under the Act - \$70.

Section 192 - sexual intercourse and gross indecency without consent	Section 192A - direction to jury in certain sexual offence trials

Section 194 - kidnapping for ransom	Section 195 - kidnapping
Section 196 - deprivation of liberty	Section 211 - robbery
Section 212 - assault with intent to steal	Section 227 - criminal deception
Section 228 - blackmail and extortion	Section 229 - Receiving stolen property, &c.
