AMENDMENTS OF COBOURG PENINSULA ABORIGINAL LAND AND SANCTUARY (ENTRY AND CAMPING) BY-LAWS

1. APPLICATION OF BY-LAWS

By-law 2(g) of the Cobourg Peninsula Aboriginal Land and Sanctuary (Entry and Camping) By-laws is amended by omitting "17 years" and substituting "16 years".

2. REPEAL AND SUBSTITUTION

By-law 3 of the Cobourg Peninsula Aboriginal Land and Sanctuary (Entry and Camping) By-laws is repealed.

3. CAMPING

By-law 4 of the Cobourg Peninsula Aboriginal Land and Sanctuary (Entry and Camping) By-laws is amended -

(a) by omitting from clause (2) (b) "the holder of" and substituting "authorised to do so by"; and

(b) by inserting after clause (3) the following:

"(3A) A camping permit granted under clause (3) to a person who enters the sanctuary in a motor vehicle authorises the holder and 4 other persons to camp in a camping area for 7 nights.

"(3B) In addition to the persons referred to in clause (3A), a person may camp in a camping area under a camping permit granted to a person who enters the sanctuary in a motor vehicle if the fee specified in bylaw 5(2) is paid for each night the person camps in the camping area.

"(3C) A camping permit granted under clause (3) to a person who enters the sanctuary from a vessel or aircraft authorises the holder to camp in a camping area for the number of nights specified in the camping permit.".

4. REPEAL AND SUBSTITUTION

By-law 5 of the Cobourg Peninsula Aboriginal Land and Sanctuary (Entry and Camping) By-laws is repealed and the following substituted:

"5. CAMPING FEES

"(1) The fee for a camping permit granted to a person who enters the sanctuary in a motor vehicle is \$200.

"(2) The fee for a person referred to in by-law 4(3B) to camp in a camping area is \$10.

"(3) The fee for a camping permit granted to a person who enters the sanctuary by a vessel or aircraft is \$15 for each night the person intends to camp in the camping area.".
