### Regulations under the Work Health Act

### AMENDMENTS OF WORK HEALTH REGULATIONS

### 1. DEFINITION OF "WORKER"

Regulation 3A of the Work Health Regulations is amended by adding at the end the following:

"(2) For the purposes of paragraph (q) of the definition of 'worker' in section 3 of the Act, a member of the operations branch of St. John Ambulance Australia (N.T.) Inc. is a person prescribed for the purpose of that definition.".

# 2. REPEAL AND SUBSTITUTION

Regulation 4 of the Work Health Regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

# "4. PRESCRIBED MEMBER OF FAMILY

"For the purposes of section 3(2) of the Act, a husband or wife (including a de facto husband or wife), a parent (including a stepmother or stepfather) or grand-parent, a child (including a stepchild) or grandchild, a brother or sister (including a half brother or half sister) are prescribed members of the immediate family of an employer.

### Work Health Regulations

#### "4A. DOMESTIC EMPLOYEE OF HOUSEHOLDER

"For the purposes of section 3(8A) of the Act -

- (a) a person employed by a householder to perform ironing, house cleaning or cooking duties in the householder's home, or as a chauffeur for the householder or a member of the householder's family, who earns, in a week, more than 13% of the average weekly earnings is a prescribed employee; and
- (b) a person referred to in paragraph (a) employed to perform the duties specified in that paragraph is not paid at a rate that would exceed the amount specified in that paragraph unless the person, in a week, earns more than that amount.".
