Regulations 1987, No. 5*

By-laws under the *University College of the*Northern Territory Act

The Council of the University College of the Northern Territory, in pursuance of section 43 of the *University College of the Northern Territory Act* and the approval of the Council at a meeting held on 13 April, 1986, hereby makes the following By-laws.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF THE NORTHERN TERRITORY

BY-LAWS GOVERNING TRAFFIC ON COLLEGE SITES

1. PRESCRIPTION OF AREAS AND SIGNS

The Warden is authorised -

- (a) to set apart any place or places on a site as a parking place or loading zone for vehicles;
- (b) in relation to any place or class of places so set apart to specify -
 - (i) the hours during which it may be used;
 - (ii) the person or class of persons entitled to use it;
 - (iii) the length of time any vehicle may remain there:
 - (iv) such other matters as may be desirable to regulate the use of such places;
- (c) to have erected on or near roadways such traffic signs as may be necessary or desirable for the regulation and control of traffic.
- 2. No person shall at any time -
 - (a) park a vehicle on any part of a site not set apart by the Warden as a parking or loading zone for vehicles;

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- (b) permit a vehicle to stand in a loading zone, unless the driver or other person is then actually engaged in picking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods to or from the vehicle, and in any case for no more than two minutes if picking up or setting down passengers, or thirty minutes when loading or unloading goods.
- 3. Where on any area parking spaces are indicated by markings on the roadway or otherwise a person shall not park in that area except in a space so indicated and so that no part of the vehicle overlaps any of the said markings.
- 4. The Registrar may, each year, register persons who are entitled to drive or park vehicles on the site. The Registrar shall forward to each person registered a label which shall be affixed where it may be lawfully attached so as to be visible on the windscreen to a person standing in front of the vehicle.
- 5. The Registrar may, with the approval of the Warden, cancel or suspend for such period and under such conditions as the Warden may approve the Registration of any person who commits a breach of this By-law.
- 6. Visitors to the College shall park in those places indicated as being reserved for visitors. No registered vehicle shall park in places reserved for visitors.
- 7. A person shall not ride, drive, or otherwise move or use any vehicle, park any vehicle or permit it to stand on any area of the site, unless permitted to do so under the provisions of this By-law.

Nothing in this section shall prevent a vehicle which is an emergency vehicle from entering or being used on the site.

- 8. A person shall not park a bicycle, motor scooter, or motor bike, other than a motor cycle fitted with a side-car on any place where the marked parking spaces of an area appropriate to four-wheeled vehicles.
- 9. A person shall not park a vehicle other than a motor scooter or a motor cycle not fitted with a side-car in any space where the signs indicate that the area is reserved for such vehicles.
- 10. A person shall not park any vehicle other than a bicycle in any space where signs indicate that the area is reserved for bicycles, or near racks provided for bicycles.
- 11. The Warden or an officer authorised by him may have erected signs to indicate that a particular person or particular class of persons may park in a specified parking space or spaces.

No person other than the Warden or an officer authorised by him may reserve an area as a parking area, for any person or persons, or for any vehicle or class of vehicles.

- 12. A person in charge of a vehicle entering the site shall not drive or park a vehicle on any footpath, lawn, recreation area, garden or other part of the site not constructed as a carriage-way or parking area.
- 13. A person in charge of a vehicle entering the site shall accept directions from any officer of the College authorised to do so, and provide such officer with any information reasonably required.
- 14. A person shall not drive a vehicle on any road or a parking area on a site at a speed greater than the speed limit indicated by traffic signs or at more than 40 kilometres per hour where no traffic sign is placed.
- 15. (a) Subject to section (b) and (c) of this section, where any breach of this By-law is committed a person who at the time of the commission of the breach was the owner of the vehicle involved shall be deemed to have committed the breach and may be proceeded against and shall be punishable accordingly.
 - (b) A person shall not by virtue of this section be deemed guilty of a breach of this By-law if -
 - (i) the Registrar is provided with a statutory declaration stating facts which provide to the satisfaction of the Registrar that some other person actually committed the breach, and stating the name and address of the person concerned;
 - (ii) the Registrar is provided with a statutory declaration stating facts which prove to the satisfaction of the Registrar that the vehicle had been sold before the time that the breach was committed, and stating the name and address of the person to whom the vehicle was sold;
 - (iii) at the time of the breach, the vehicle had been stolen or was being used unlawfully without the owner's consent and prove to proceedings under this By-law being commenced, the owner had reported the theft or unlawful use to the police;

(c) Where any breach of this By-law is committed and the owner of the vehicle involved is a student or employee of the College, or the parent, spouse, child of a student or employee of the College, that student or employee shall be deemed, unless the contrary is proved, to have committed that breach and may be proceeded against accordingly.

16. If any person commits or is deemed to commit a breach of this By-law, he shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$1000. Proceedings to recover or enforce any such penalty may be taken by the Registrar.

1. CITATION

These Regulations may be cited as the Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Regulations.

2. FORM OF INSTRUMENT OF TRANSFER
