Regulations under the *Classification of Publications Act*

I, JOHN ARMSTRONG ENGLAND, the Administrator of the Northern Territory of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *Classification of Publications Act*.

CLASSIFICATION OF PUBLICATIONS REGULATIONS

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Classification of Publications Regulations.
2. For the purposes of section 3 of the Act, all libraries under the control of—
 - (a) the Minister of Education;
 - (b) a non-Government school within the meaning of the *Education Act*; or
 - (c) the Department of Community Development,are prescribed to be libraries to or in relation to which the Act does not apply.
3. For the purposes of section 29(3) of the Act—
 - (a) the prescribed manner of wrapping a direct sale publication is to wrap the publication completely in opaque wrapping and seal it; and
 - (b) the prescribed manner of marking the publication is to endorse clearly on the publication the words "DIRECT SALE PUBLICATION, NORTHERN TERRITORY. NOT AVAILABLE TO PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS".
4. For the purposes of section 32(1)(b) of the Act—
 - (a) the prescribed manner of wrapping a restricted publication is to wrap the publication completely in opaque wrapping and seal it; and
 - (b) the prescribed manner of marking the publication is to endorse clearly on the publication the words "RESTRICTED PUBLICATION, NORTHERN TERRITORY. NOT AVAILABLE TO PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS".
- 5.(1) For the purposes of sections 39(3)(a) and 40(3)(a) of the Act, the business of a pharmacist conducted by a registered pharmacist within the meaning of the *Pharmacy Act* is prescribed.
- (2) For the purposes of sections 39(3)(b) and 40(3)(b) of the Act, the prescribed condition is that the sale of the sexual articles is ancillary and subsidiary to the conduct of the business referred to in sub-regulation (1).

6. For the purposes of section 42(3) of the Act, a part of a shop—
- (a) which is not a window or entrance recess;
 - (b) which is so constructed or partitioned off that—
 - (i) it is not capable of being used by persons who only wish to move through the shop; and
 - (ii) its contents are not visible to persons outside the part; and
 - (c) outside of which there is displayed a clearly visible sign with the words “CLASSIFIED PUBLICATIONS AREA. PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS MAY NOT ENTER. THE PUBLIC IS WARNED THAT SOME PUBLICATIONS FOR SALE INSIDE MAY CAUSE OFFENCE”,

is a part of a shop constructed, set aside and marked in the prescribed manner.

7. For the purposes of section 49 of the Act, the prescribed qualifications and experience in the field of literature, art, medicine or science is a degree or diploma conferred or recognized by an Australian university or college of advanced education in the field of literature, art, medicine or science together with not less than 5 years practical experience in the field in which the degree or diploma was obtained since the degree or diploma was obtained.
