
Regulations under the *Lottery and Gaming Act*

I, JOHN ARMSTRONG ENGLAND, the Administrator of the Northern Territory of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *Lottery and Gaming Act*.

AMENDMENTS OF THE LOTTERY
AND GAMING REGULATIONS

1. Regulation 25 of the Lottery and Gaming Regulations is repealed and the following regulation substituted:

"25.(1) In this regulation—

'business of the Board' in relation to the Chairman or a member of the Board means—

- (a) attendance at a meeting of the Board;
- (b) engagement with the prior approval of the Board on business of the Board; or
- (c) where the Chairman or a member does not reside in the locality where such a meeting is held or such business is conducted — travel to or from such a meeting or in connexion with such business;

'Chairman' means the person who is the Chairman of the Board, being a person who is not a prescribed person;

'member' means a person who is a member of the Board, being a person who is not the Chairman or a prescribed person;

'prescribed person' means a person who is—

- (a) a Judge of the Supreme Court;
- (b) a stipendiary magistrate appointed under the provisions of the *Magistrates Act*;
- (c) an employee of the Public Service of the Northern Territory; or
- (d) an officer or an employee of the Australian Public Service.

“(2) Subject to sub-regulation (3), the fee payable to the Chairman or a member in respect of each day on which he undertakes business of the Board shall be—

- (a) in the case of the Chairman — \$60; and
- (b) in the case of a member — \$54.

“(3) Where the business of the Board referred to in sub-regulation (2) does not continue for longer than 4 hours, the fee payable to the Chairman or a member, if the person resides in the locality where the business is conducted, shall be an amount calculated—

- (a) in the case of the Chairman — at the rate of \$12; and
- (b) in the case of a member — at the rate of \$10,

for each hour or part of an hour that the business continues.

“(4) Where the Chairman or a member is required by the business of the Board to stay overnight at a place other than his place of residence, he shall be paid an allowance of \$45 for each such night.

“(5) The Board may pay to the Chairman or a member such transport expenses including fares at first-class rates as, in the opinion of the Board, are reasonably incurred by the Chairman or that member in connexion with the business of the Board.

“(6) Where the Chairman or a member attends a meeting of the Board and is also on the same day engaged on other business of the Board, the Chairman or member, as the case may be, is entitled to be paid once only under this regulation in respect of the attendance and engagement on that day.”

Allowance
for past
actions

2.(1) The Chairman or a member of the Board, being a person who became the Chairman or a member of the Board prior to the date of commencement of these Regulations may be paid—

- (a) an allowance, as determined by the Board; and
- (b) expenses which, in the opinion of the Board, were reasonably incurred,

in respect of any meeting of the Board that the Chairman or the member attended or any business of the Board that the Chairman or the member undertook with the prior approval of the Board during the period from and including 1 January 1978 to and including the day immediately before the commencement of these Regulations.

(2) A payment under sub-regulation (1) shall not be made without the approval of the Minister.

(3) A payment made to the Chairman or a member of the Board under sub-regulation (1) shall not be more than the remuneration that would have been payable to him for attending the meeting or undertaking the business referred to in that sub-regulation if these Regulations had come into operation on 1 January 1978.
